Please take note of the following important information;

#### COMMUNICATION:

We also encourage our parents to come directly to the admin office for clarification on any broad casted information. These numbers are operational between the hours of 8 am - 3pm, Mondays to Fridays. Please do not abuse this service as staff members may be in class or carrying out their duties.

We also expect our parents to inform the office in the event of a sick child, travel plans or an outright school transfer. This is to help with monitoring your child and also for record purposes.

The departmental heads are also available to put you through your child's <u>academic progress</u>. If you so wish they can give you all the information you need about class work and what is expected of your child. Please feel free to use this service as they are always available.

#### SCHOOL FEES:

As is the long old tradition of Cita International School, fees are reviewed every 2 years. Parents are informed officially of this upgrade and review in the  $3^{rd}$  (third) term prior to the new school fee session, which is 5 months notice.

#### Payment of Fees:

For those parents that are new to our system or old parents who may have forgotten our method of fee payment, here is a step by step guide on how school fees should be paid.

We have the following options for fee payment.

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#### BANK TELLERS:

Bank tellers are signed by a school official for security and control and are kept at the security lodge for your convenience.

After payment by bank teller, return the blue copy to Mrs. Allen at the admin. Office with your child/children's name and class clearly written at the back of the teller.

#### BANK DRAFT:

A bank draft can be made from any bank of your choice.
The draft beneficiary should be **CITA INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL** not CITA HIGH OR
CITA NURSERY AND PRIMARY SCHOOLS OR
C.I.T.A. INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL

Once again your child/children's name should be clearly written at the back of your bank draft.

#### ONLINE PAYMENT

This is only accepted if a printed copy of the transactions is presented at the admin. Office, as usual with the child/children's name(s) and class written on the document.

#### POS

We have a POS machine available with Mrs. Allen at the admin. Office; the above mentioned procedure also obtains for this method.

There is a two weeks grace in this third term for payment of fees. Children that have no record of fee payment after this period will not be allowed into the classroom. Please present copies of proof of payment to the office to avoid any embarrassment.

#### ADMISSION:

The Admission procedure for new parents will end on  $31^{st}$  of May 2014. All old parents that have the intention of enrolling their new babies in the pre-toddler and Toddler classes should please inform the admin office. We usually attend to our old parents first before enrolling brand new clients. Thank you for your co-operation on this issue.

#### USE OF FOUL LANGUAGE AND VERNACULAR

We appeal to our esteemed parents to please desist from the use of foul language and vernacular in and around the school premises as well as around your children as they could copy your choice of words. It has come to our notice that some of our parents have the habit of abusing members of staff in front of their children and using foul language on them.

Hair extensions of any sort are strictly prohibited. Pupils are not allowed to use beads of any size in making their hair to school because this could cause great harm to them.

#### From The HOD Primary

Welcome back from the Easter Holiday, we do sincerely hope it was a restful holiday for you.

In CITA, we value the confidence and trust you have in our ability to work with your children. We look forward to working together to achieve our set goals for the term. We understand that there is nothing more precious than a child and nothing more important than preparing a child for the challenges of the future.

#### HOMEWORK AND RESEARCH:

We are uncompromising in our commitment to provide high quality education as the world is consistently evolving. To this effect pupils in Primary 3, 4, and 5 will be required to carry out a lot of research and project works that will further enhance whatever lessons have been taught in school.

Parents are therefore encouraged to ask the class teachers for the relevant materials, sites and whatever will ease the work for the child.

Homework for the P3 class in this summer term is daily as in  $P_4$  and  $P_5$ .

#### STUDY NOTES:

In line with the quality of educational you want for your children, pupils are encouraged to pick up their note books daily from their classes before going. In essence Parents should request for these books from the class teachers before leaving the classroom environment. This will further help parents work on revising the day's activities with their children. Please note that every book taken home must be returned in tact to the class teacher.

#### **Punctuality:**

Parents are encouraged to drop their children off in school early as classes (instructions) begin at 8 am prompt. Pupils who arrive in school after classes have begun often have a hard time settling down to the day's activity, especially during assessments or exams.

#### Dear Parents/Guardians,

We welcome you back from the Easter holidays. We are thankful to God for bringing us into another summer and for His protection towards us.

#### (1) Lost Items

Parents should check the lost items pile before replacing the so-called "lost or stolen" items.

#### (2) School Uniforms

All school uniforms, socks, etc. should be monogrammed discreetly with the names of the students. Failure to do so would result in the students being sent back home and not returning until they have had their uniforms and accessories monogrammed.

It should also be noted that students found not having complete set of uniforms on the day of resumption would be required to purchase such items from the bookshop on site. In the event that the student does not have complete uniforms during term time, such items would be issued to the student and the parents would be billed. It is therefore important to ensure that your child/ward has the complete set of uniforms.

#### (3) Amendment of Uniforms

It has been observed that students are in the habit amending their uniforms to make them more tight fitting in the case of the girls skirts and Sunday wear and slim fitting in the case of boys' uniform trousers. Any such students caught would be issued new uniforms and the parents would be billed. We there urge our parents to help us in curbing this habit.

#### (4) Footwear

We have he noticed that some students wear the wrong school shoes. Parents are pleased advised to purchase the correct school shoes from the bookshop. Any student found with the wrong shoes would result in the shoes being confiscated. The students would be given the right shoes and the parents would be billed. We would do our part to ensure that they are readily available.

It has also come to our attention that most students wear slippers during sports resulting in foot injuries especially during football matches. Parents are therefore advised to get proper footwear such as white snickers, which can be obtained from the bookshop as well. Students who are interested in playing football must get football boots. This is all in the interest of the safety of our students as well as to minimise injuries.

#### (5) Letters

Requests for Letters Identification for Visa purposes and leavers reports must come to the Administrative Office two (2) weeks prior to the date. Also visa appointments and interviews for your child/ward should be planned in such a way that it does not interfere with classes. However Parents wishing to pick up their child/ward during term time should put it in writing. Requests would be subject to approval.

#### (6) **Health & First Aid**

Our first aid units/sick bay serve emergencies. It is impossible to first notify Parents before administering emergency procedures. Any parent who objects to this must put their objection in writing.

It is also important that parents inform the school if there is any medical history with their children to enable us take the appropriate action when

#### (7) New Grading Scheme

In order to encourage our students to work harder, our grading system has been revised as follows:

80 - 100 - A

70 - 79 - B

60 - 69 - C

50 - 59 - D

40 - 49 - E

0 - 39 - F

It would also be important to note that the cut off mark for promotion to the next class has been set at **60%**. Parents are therefore encouraged to help us work together to achieve this in the interest of their children.

#### (8) Visiting Day

Visiting day is scheduled for Sunday the 25<sup>th</sup> of May 2014. Parents are therefore advised to go back home with food items that have not been consumed or dispose of left over items. Bin bags would be provided to facilitate this. Food items are not allowed into the hostels. This is to prevent rat infestations, which could be a health risk to your children, our students.

On this note please be advised that any food items found on students after visiting day would be confiscated and disposed of. Also the kitchen would not accept any food items for storage.

#### (9) Payment of Fees

All school fees should be paid two weeks prior to the resumption date. Payments should be made by bank draft in favour of CITA INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL. All bank drafts made in favour of CITA HIGH SCHOOL or CITA INTERNATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL would not be accepted. Please be informed that all those owing school fees will not be allowed into the school premises after the midterm break. Once again be reminded that it is school policy that fees are paid during the holiday before the beginning of any term. However a two weeks grace period is given. Parents still owing any form of fees after this grace period will agree with the school's ensuing action.

#### (10) eSchools

Parents should please note that the eSchools system is not just for assignments and chatting amongst students. There is a portal for parents where newsletters can be accessed via a username and password. If you have not received any of these please contact the school and we would be more than happy to assist you. The most recent newsletter can also be accessed via the home page of the school's website <a href="https://www.citainternationalschool.org">www.citainternationalschool.org</a>. We are appealing to parents to please read the newsletter as communications from the school are contained therein.

Parents are also advised to monitor the activities of their children on the Internet particularly during the use of the eSchools student chat. It was found that during the holidays some students made use of profanities and vulgar language whilst they chatted online. Please be aware that the eSchools system flags such profanities and notifies us. Therefore any student found using profanities on the system would be punished.
