Just a few reminders

BE ALERT!

We will all agree with the rising level of insecurity in the City and State as a whole and hence we would like to use this opportunity to appeal to our parents to instil in our children the importance of being alert and observant especially around drop off and pick up time.

Please take note of the following pointers/ safety reminders

1 Ensure that your child is signed in and handed over to an employee of the school.

Do not ask an unknown person or unfamiliar adult to assist you with signing In your child.

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2 Don't drop off your child at the end of the road to the school and ask them to walk to the gate. If you have no other option but this; watch them carefully and make sure they enter the school premises safely.

3 During pick up time, sign your child out and ensure that they are with you all the way back to your car. Do not sign your child out if you are having a conversation with another adult and ask them to walk to the car alone. It is safe to keep them in the classrooms until you are done with what you are doing.

Please send proper notice when you aren't able to pick up your child. We don't accept phone notices as there is the possibility that you may be speaking under duress.

5. Please inform the school of any change or termination of appointment with your employed staff.

6 Be paranoid! Observe your environment, the people and movement around you, it could save your life. The fact that you are suspicious and observant will keep you alert.
