Dear Parents/Guardians,

As we come to the end of another successful Easter Term, we want to say thank you for entrusting you children into our care. We are grateful to God for preserving each of us. As we go home for the holidays we would like you to take note of the following information

(1) Lost Items

Parents should check the lost items pile before replacing the so-called "lost or stolen" items.

(2) <u>School Uniforms</u>

All school uniforms, socks, etc. should be monogrammed discreetly with the names of the students. Failure to do so would result in the students being sent back home and not returning until they have had their uniforms and accessories monogrammed.

It should also be noted that students found not having complete set of uniforms on the day of resumption would be required to purchase such items from the bookshop on site. In the event that the student does not have complete uniforms during term time, such items would be issued to the student and the parents would be billed. It is therefore important to ensure that your child/ward has the complete set of uniforms.

(3) <u>Amendment of Uniforms</u>

It has been observed that students are in the habit amending their uniforms to make them more tight fitting in the case of the girls skirts and Sunday wear and slim fitting in the case of boys' uniform trousers. Any such students caught would be issued new uniforms and the parents would be billed. We there urge our parents to help us in curbing this habit.

(4) Footwear

We have he noticed that some students wear the wrong school shoes. Parents are pleased advised to purchase the correct school shoes from the bookshop. Any student found with the wrong shoes would result in the shoes being confiscated. The students would be given the right shoes and the parents would be billed. We would do our part to ensure that they are readily available.

It has also come to our attention that most students wear slippers during sports resulting in foot injuries especially during football matches. Parents are therefore advised to get proper footwear such as white snickers, which can be obtained from the bookshop as well. Students who are interested in playing football must get football boots. This is all in the interest of the safety of our students as well as to minimise injuries.

(5) Letters

Requests for Letters Identification for Visa purposes and leavers reports must come to the Administrative Office two (2) weeks prior to the date. Also visa appointments and interviews for your child/ward should be planned in such a way that it does not interfere with classes. However Parents wishing to pick up their child/ward during term time should put it in writing. Requests would be subject to approval.

(6) Health & First Aid

Our first aid units/sick bay serve emergencies. It is impossible to first notify Parents before administering emergency procedures. Any parent who objects to this must put their objection in writing.

Parents are also advised to please ensure that their children are in good health before they are dropped off at school on the day of resumption. Parents should treat for malaria and deworm their children. It is also important that parents inform the school if there is any medical history with their children to enable us take the appropriate action when

(7) New Grading Scheme

In order to encourage our students to work harder, our grading system has been revised as follows:

 $\begin{array}{l} 80 - 100 - A \\ 70 - 79 - B \\ 60 - 69 - C \\ 50 - 59 - D \\ 40 - 49 - E \\ 0 - 39 - F \end{array}$

It would also be important to note that the cut off mark for promotion to the next class has been set at **60%**. Parents are therefore encouraged to help us work together to achieve this in the interest of their children.

(8) <u>Punctuality</u>

It has come to our notice that some parents bring their children back to school late into the term. This affects the children academically in that they find it difficult to catch up and this in turn affects their grades. Moving forward parents who do not bring their children back to school on the assigned date of resumption would be sanctioned with a fine of NGN20000.00 (Twenty Thousand Naira). Children coming late on health grounds must provide a written doctor's report on resumption. Same sanctions will apply if one cannot be provided.

(9) <u>Toiletries</u>

The school provides toiletries for all students. However students have been found with their own toiletries with the excuse of reacting to the toiletries provided by the school. Henceforth a written doctor's report would be required for the school to accept your child/ward's toiletries.

(10) Visiting Day

Visiting day is scheduled for Sunday the 25th of May 2014. Parents are therefore advised to go back home with food items that have not been consumed or dispose of left over items. Bin bags would be provided to facilitate this. Food items are not allowed into the hostels. This is to prevent rat infestations, which could be a health risk to your children, our students.

On this note please be advised that any food items found on students after visiting day would be confiscated and disposed of. Also the kitchen would not accept any food items for storage.

(11) Payment of Fees

All school fees should be paid two weeks prior to the resumption date. Payments should be made by bank draft in favour of **CITA INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL. All bank drafts made in favour of CITA HIGH SCHOOL or CITA INTERNATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL would not be accepted.** Please be informed that all those owing school fees will not be allowed into the school premises after the midterm break. Once again be reminded that it is school policy that fees are paid during the holiday before the beginning of any term. However a two weeks grace period is given. Parents still owing any form of fees after this grace period will agree with the school's ensuing action.

(12) <u>E-Assignments</u>

As you are aware, e-assignments are usually given every holiday. Students are expected to start checking their e-schools portal for their assignments from Tuesday, 8th April 2014.
